

What is a policy? Are you familiar with it? How does it help us all feel safe?






Ballaugh School is a telling school

- Name calling
- Mocking
- Making threats
- Make somebody feel silly
- Play tricks
- Spitting or hurting
- Pushing about
- Unkind messages on-line
- Non-verbal facial expressions

Why do we need to do something about bullying?

- Bullying hurts
- Everyone has the right to be treated with respect
- People who are bullies need to learn more acceptable ways to behave both in school and outside of school.
- Schools need to be prompt (why is that important) and effective (what would an effective solution look like?)

-when it happened
-name of staff it was reported to
-if any action was taken when it was
reported
School will phone the parents of the
aggrieved
The bullying will be investigated
