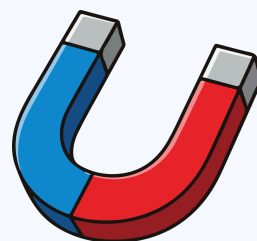


The topic will conclude with a family assembly where we will share our learning and take you with us, back 350 years, to the Great Fire.

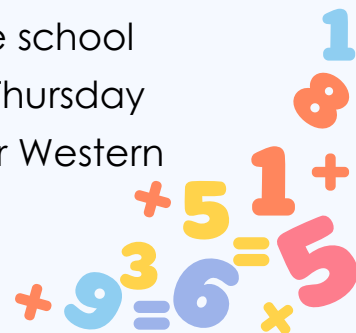


Welcome

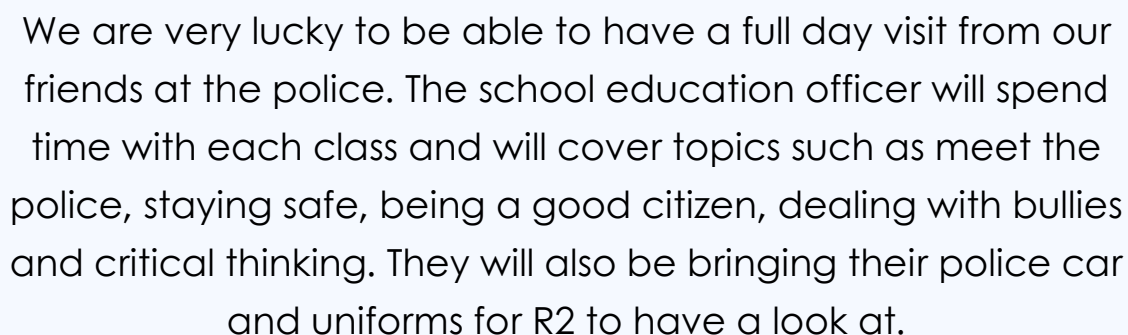

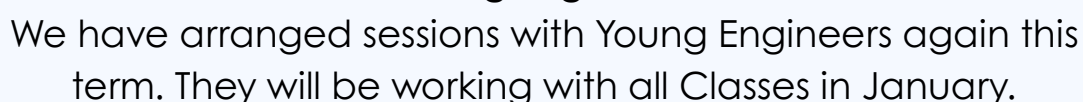
Police Visit
